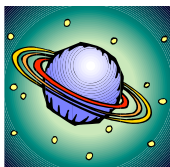
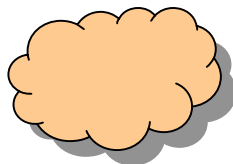

LIFE SCIENCE MODULE – GRADE ONE - CH
LESSON 2: Living and Non-living Things and God Created Everything.

GENERAL CONCEPT: Differences between Living and Non-Living Things

SCIENCE LESSON CONCEPT

There are 3 qualities (grow, move, and change) which help us classify living things and non-living things.

GOAL OF SCIENCE LESSON

Student will know that the abilities to grow, move, and change distinguish living things from non-living things.

OUTCOME EXPECTED

Student can sort and classify things into living and non-living groups.

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Actual and/or pictures of living and non-living things: rock, person, sun, cloud, tree and animal
- Science Journal Page: LIVING THINGS

RELIGION LESSON CONCEPT

God is our Father who created everything: living and non-living things.

GOAL OF RELIGION LESSON

Student will know that God created everything.

OUTCOME EXPECTED

Student will learn the Creation story of Genesis and know that God created it all.

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Genesis 1 – Creation story from Bible

- Science Journal Page: NON-LIVING THINGS
- Crayons
- A box or container for all the things
- 2 boxes or containers: Living things & non-living things
- Three cardboard phrase aids: CAN MOVE, CAN GROW, CAN CHANGE
- One cardboard phrase aid: ALL ON ITS OWN POWER
- Several containers of living and non-living things
Rocks, plants, soil, pinecones, seashells, flowers

SCIENCE METHODOLOGY

- **PUT** all the living and non-living things in front of the student in a closed container.
- **POST** the cardboard phrase: ALL ON ITS OWN POWER.
- **BE** sure the student knows what it says and means.
- **POST** the phrase: CAN MOVE.
- **BE** sure the student knows what it says and means.
- **POST** the phrase: CAN GROW.

- Paper
- Crayons
- CD Player
- Song about various creatures
- Container labeled: LIVING THINGS
- Container labeled: NON-LIVING THINGS
- A variety of living and non-living things placed in the room.

RELIGION METHODOLOGY

- **BEGIN** with a prayer service singing a song about various creatures.
- **READ** the Genesis I: creation story from the Bible.
- **CLOSE** with a song about creatures.
- **DIVIDE** the class into groups. Give each group a container. Each group is gathering living or non-living things. Appoint a secretary for each group to give the report.

- **DISCUSS** how they knew the items that belonged in that group. (move, grow, change all on its own = living)
- **BE** sure the student knows what it says and means.
- **POST** the phrase: CAN CHANGE
- **BE** sure the student knows what it says and means.
- **OPEN** the container. Take out each item. Help the student use the three qualities of living things to put each item in the correct container. Go through all the items.
- **GIVE** the student the Science Journal Page: LIVING THINGS. Have them draw and identify a few living things.
- **GIVE** the student the Science Journal Page: NON-LIVING THINGS. Have them draw and identify a few non-living things.
- **POSIT:** Living Things can move, grow, and change all on their own.

- **ASK:** Who made all these things?(God)
- **ASK:** How do you know? (The Bible – God’s Truth)
- **HAVE** the children draw and color one living and one non-living creature.
- **POST** the pictures in the two categories.
- **POSIT:** God is our Father who created everything.
